Admission Standards

Standard Admission

Making certain that students are prepared to be successful is of primary importance to us when making admission decisions. We examine your high school record, including courses completed, grades earned, class rank, and standardized test results. In general, we use the following standards when making admission decisions:

1. High School Graduation

You must have graduated or be graduating before enrollment. If you have completed the GED, see the section below entitled "GED Admission." Students who are home-schooled are welcomed as applicants; submit your transcript with your application and test score results.

2. Courses Completed

If you are a current Indiana high school student, you are expected to complete Core 40 and are strongly encouraged to earn the Academic Honors Diploma. If you are not in an Indiana high school, you should complete the following core of classes to be considered for admission:

- 4 years of college-preparatory English;
- 3-4 years of mathematics, including second-year algebra. We highly recommend 4 years;

- 3 years of social sciences;
- 3 years of laboratory science;
- 4 years of some combination of foreign language, computer science or additional mathematics, laboratory sciences, social sciences, or English courses.

3. Grades

Though no grade point average guarantees admission to IUPUI, we generally expect to see students with a "B" average when reviewing applications. The trend in your grades and the difficulty of your courses are also very important, and we review favorably those students who have improved their grades in their junior and senior years.

4. Test Results

You must provide the results of your SAT or ACT, including the Writing Section of the test (scores must be received at IUPUI by May 1). If your class has graduated and a fall semester has passed since you graduated, you do not need to take the SAT or ACT. Adult students over the age of 21 should note that SAT or ACT scores are not required. (However, if you did take the test, we would like to see the results.) The results of the Writing Section assist you and your academic advisor with placement into a writing course. Though test results are considered during the admission review, we do not deny students strictly based on their test results. The SAT or

ACT is most important when considering you for scholarships.

5. Other Circumstances to be Considered

Although a high school transcript is the primary criteria for admission, the Admissions Committee also considers such things as military experience, life experiences, and job responsibilities after leaving high school.

Conditional Admission

If you do not meet the above criteria, you will be considered for the possibility of conditional acceptance based on other factors that will indicate your potential for success at IUPUI: overall quality of your high school coursework, trends in your grades, test scores, and military service.

Deferral to a Community College

If you have significant deficiencies in either academic preparation or performance, we will defer your application until you complete designated courses at any regionally accredited two- or four-year college. A deferral contract outlining the courses you must complete will be sent to you. If you reside in the Indianapolis region, we have a special program with Ivy Tech Community College at Indianapolis. You can learn more about this program by visiting www.iupui.edu/~ivy.

Tips for a Smooth Application Review

There are several things you can do to make sure that your application is reviewed quickly and easily. Here are a few tips:

- #1 Apply online by going to enroll.iupui.edu; however, if you do use the paper application, print clearly and legibly in black ink.
- #2 Apply before the priority date (see p. 2).
- #3 Answer all questions on the application.
- #4 Be sure to enclose a check for \$50 if you apply with a paper application.
- #5 Use the same name on all of your application materials.
- #6 If you are currently enrolled in high school and apply using this paper application, complete Part One then promptly forward the application with application fee to your high school counselor for completion of Part Two.
- #7 Send all your materials in a single packet.
- #8 Make sure you have taken the SAT or ACT including the Writing Section, and submit this score to our office no later than May 1. Our school code is 1325 for the SAT and 1214 for the ACT.

FRESHMAN APPLICATION INFORMATION

GED Admission

If you have completed the GED, but have not attended a college or university, you are considered a beginning freshman. The following are the admission requirements:

- You must receive an average score of 53 (530 on the new scale) or higher on the GED and a score of 50 (500 on new scale) on the writing section. If your GED scores are below these requirements, you will be deferred to a community college. (See above section on conditional admission.)
- If you are under 19 years of age, you must provide the results of an ACT or SAT test.

Programs with Separate Deadlines and Additional Requirements

Dental Assisting

Submit an IUPUI application by May 1 and a separate application, available online, by June 1. Obtain the application at enroll.iupui.edu/dental. Call 317-274-4407 for more information on the program.

Radiography

Freshman applicants are eligible to apply for direct entry into the Radiography Program and should apply for the Summer Session II term. Direct entry applicants must complete English composition and college algebra for college credit prior to entry. To apply, submit both an IUPUI application and a Health Professions Programs application by November 15 of the year prior to entry. The HPP application may be obtained by calling 317-278-4752, e-mailing askhpp@iupui.edu, or consulting www.medicine.iu.edu/hpp. Applications for this program received after this date will be considered for regular admission, and students must re-apply by the program's deadline the following year to be considered for entry in the next class.

The Application Process

Admissions Timeline

Once your application is complete, a decision or request for additional information will be sent to you. A complete application will include an application, application fee, high school transcript, and SAT or ACT scores (including the Writing Section).

Checking the Status of Your Application

If you provide us with your e-mail address when you apply, you will receive an e-mail from us with instructions on creating your account where you can then check the status of your application online. The e-mail will be sent after your application is initially processed.

Important Information

Ethnicity

Ethnic information is gathered in compliance with the definitions and procedures included in the 1997 revision of the OMB Statistical Policy Directive No. 15 and the U.S. Department of Education Final Guidance on Maintaining, Collecting, and Reporting Racial and Ethnic Data to the Department of Education (Federal Register, Vol. 72, No. 202, 10/19/2008). This information will not be used in determining your admissibility to IUPUI.

IUPUI prohibits discrimination based on arbitrary consideration of such characteristics as age, color, disability, ethnicity, marital status, national origin, race, religion, sexual orientation, or veteran status.

Social Security Number

You will be assigned a ten-digit number that will be your University I.D. That number will be included with your admission correspondence. Your Social Security Number will not be used for this purpose.

Please note that *Section 483 and 484 of the Higher Education Act (HEA) of 1965, as amended, provide the Department of Education the authority to ask you and your parents the questions on the FAFSA and to collect the Social Security numbers of you and your parents. State and institutional student financial aid programs also may use the information that you provide on the FAFSA to determine if you are eligible to receive state and institutional aid.*

Application Fee

A nonrefundable \$50 application fee is required and must be paid by check if applying with a paper application. **Make the check payable to IUPUI. Do not send cash.** Applications will not be reviewed until the application fee has been paid.

You must pay the application fee unless you

previously applied to IUPUI within the past 18 months. In this case, attach a note to the front of the application stating the month and year you previously applied.

Paying the fee to another campus of Indiana University or Purdue University does not waive this fee payment requirement. In cases of extreme financial need, current high school students should consult their high school counselor and use the College Board, NACAC, or ACT fee waiver form. Attach the fee waiver form to the front of the application.

Students with Education Outside the United States

If you are a U.S. citizen, permanent resident, refugee or asylee and the last year of your education was in the United States, you should apply through the Office of Undergraduate Admissions. U.S. citizens who attend American schools or international schools that hold U.S. accreditation or Department of Defense Schools also apply through the Office of Undergraduate Admissions. All other prospective students must apply through the Office of International Affairs (OIA). OIA evaluates international educational documents and advises international students on visa matters and cultural adjustment issues. Criminal Activity Disclosure Policy

IUPUI is committed to maintaining a safe environment for all members of the University community. As part of this commitment, IUPUI requires applicants who have (1) been convicted of any felony or a misdemeanor such as simple battery or other convictions for behavior that resulted in injury to a person(s) or personal property or (2) a history of formal disciplinary action at any college or university attended to disclose this information as a mandatory step in the application process. A previous conviction or previous college disciplinary action does not automatically bar admission to the University, but does require review.

Complete information must be sent by certified mail with the application for admission to the Office of Undergraduate Admissions, 425 University Blvd., Covanaugh 147, Indianapolis, IN 46202-5143.

Applicants are responsible for maintaining the receipt certifying that the letter has been received by IUPUI. **Information should be submitted in English and should include: a brief explanation, location (city, state, country) of conviction of previous conduct, dates and court disposition.** This statement must also include a grant of permission to IUPUI for complete access to criminal records, if any. Applicants who have been disciplined at another college or university must provide a statement, which includes a brief explanation, location and

name of institution, dates, and disposition of the case. This statement must also include a grant of permission to IUPUI for complete access to disciplinary records, if any, at the previous college or university. For further information about either of these requirements, call 317-274-4591.

Transfer Credit and Advanced Standing

If you have completed college level courses while in high school or have military training, DANTES test results, CLEP test results, International Baccalaureate scores, or College Board Advanced Placement (AP) scores, please provide us with official score results. Our office will then inform you how to check the credits that have transferred online. To learn more about these areas and possible credit, consult enroll.iupui.edu/cbe.

Military Training

Military training will be evaluated for college credit. Please include a copy of your DD214 or DD295. You can receive up to eight semester hours of transfer credit for completion of basic training. Additional credits may be granted for specialized military training listed on these documents; however, the total credit will be limited to fifteen hours. Students who are admitted into Purdue programs will only receive a total of eight semester hours for all of their military experience.

Final Transcripts

If you are currently enrolled in either high school or college courses, you must arrange for a final transcript to be sent to the Office of Undergraduate Admissions. The high school transcript will be reviewed for satisfactory completion of entrance requirements and a college transcript reviewed for credit evaluation. High school seniors who have been admitted prior to final grades and who then receive a D or F in a Core 40 course required to earn the Core 40 endorsement must notify the Director of Undergraduate Admissions to discuss enrollment options.

Electronic Transcripts

IUPUI prefers that students submit their high school transcripts electronically. Students in Indiana can have their high school transcripts sent to our office using Indiana's eTranscript service. We also accept electronic transcripts via Docufiled and eScrip-Safe. Please check with your guidance counselor on how to initiate the process. If your school uses a different method of sending electronic transcripts, please have them contact us so we can learn how to receive them.
