## Important Steps to Finalize Your Enrollment at IUPUI

### Step One

#### Review Your Letter of Admission

Carefully check your name, address, and the information described below. If there are errors, you must notify us immediately.

Note the following information:

**University ID number** — You will use this ten-digit number to create your student access account.

**School/division** — Indicates who will provide academic advising.

**Major** — Your proposed area of study. Please note that entrance into a major is selective and requires final approval from the school. Completing prerequisite courses does not guarantee future selection into the major.

**Residency/Tuition** — Your status for payment of in-state or out-of-state tuition.

**Starting Term** — Your starting term is valid only for the term indicated in the letter. If you wish to change to a different term, please call the Enrollment Center at 317-274-4591 and request a change of starting term.

### Special Types of Admission

- Conditional Admission**  
 This is used when a freshman student is admitted but did not meet the requirements for regular admission. The Admissions Committee grants this admission to students who have some D and F grades in college preparatory classes or perhaps low SAT or ACT scores. The committee believes the student can be successful at IUPUI but must follow steps discussed in the letter of acceptance.
- Probationary Admission**  
 This is used when a transfer student is admitted on academic probation due to previous academic performance. The letter of acceptance provides details concerning what steps are to follow.

### Step Two

**If you have NOT created your University Network ID for IUPUI** — In your Web browser, navigate to <https://onestart.iu.edu> and click on the link "Don't have an account?" in the Login channel. You will use your last name, date of birth, and your University ID number as authentication. Since you have not yet created an account with us, this process will create your username, password reset questions, access to many University services, and your University e-mail account.

**If you HAVE created your University Network ID for IUPUI –**

Upon application, if you supplied us with an e-mail address, you received a communication about setting up your University Network ID. If you did this upon application, you are now eligible to upgrade that account to include new services and your University e-mail account. Navigate to <https://onestart.iu.edu> and log in to the applicant account. On the Self-Service tab in OneStart, in the Personal Info channel, click on the link "Manage Accounts." Follow the instructions to upgrade your account.

Once you have created or upgraded your account, you can access significant information about the University, view transfer credits, view credits from AP exams, Dantes, CLEP, and IB results (when results are received), and update your address.

**Freshman Students**

If you were admitted during your high school senior year, we remind you that graduation is mandatory, and you must have fulfilled all high school graduation requirements before enrollment at IUPUI. The Admissions Committee expects you to complete all courses that you listed on your application for admission, and we expect you to earn passing grades in all courses. If these conditions are not met, it is your responsibility to contact the Office of Admissions before you begin classes at IUPUI. Failure to do so may result in a revocation of your acceptance or administrative withdrawal from your IUPUI courses.

Students earning credits for college courses while in high school should arrange for college transcripts to be sent to the Undergraduate Office of Admissions. Students taking Advanced Placement Exams (AP) or International Baccalaureate exams (IB) should have the test results reported to IUPUI Undergraduate Admissions.

**Transfer Students**

If you are enrolled in college at the time of admission, you must arrange for a final transcript to be sent to the Undergraduate Admissions Office. The Admissions Committee expects you to complete all courses listed on your application for admission, leave your former college with a cumulative grade point average of 2.0 (on a 4.0 scale), and be eligible to return. If these conditions are not met, it is your responsibility to contact the Office of Admissions before you begin classes at IUPUI. Failure to do so may result in a revocation of your acceptance or administrative withdrawal from your IUPUI courses.

**Applying for Financial Aid**

The Office of Student Financial Aid Services awards financial assistance in the form of grants, loans, and work-study programs. In order to be considered for any of these aid programs, you must file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and have your results reported to IUPUI by listing our federal school code (001813) on your completed form.

The preferred method for filing is to complete your FAFSA online at [www.fafsa.ed.gov](http://www.fafsa.ed.gov). You can also obtain a paper FAFSA from any high school guidance office, public library, or college financial aid office.

You must file the FAFSA each year by the March 10 priority receipt date in order to be considered for some federal aid and most university-based and state-based sources of aid. Applications filed after March 10 may be limited to consideration for only federal sources of aid, such as Federal Pell Grants and Federal Stafford Loans.

**Estimated Tuition and Fee Information for Undergraduate Students**

Tuition at IUPUI is calculated by credit hours of classes at the rate of \$207 per credit hour for Indiana residents and \$586 for non-residents for the 2007–2008 academic year. Most courses are 3, 4, or 5 hours of credit. In addition to

credit-hour-based tuition, some courses have special fees such as supplies, equipment, or laboratory fees. There are also mandatory fees including technology, student activity, and athletic development fees for all students. The recreation fee and locker rental fee are optional. The student parking fee is also optional; however, students must have a valid permit in order to park on campus. Free offsite parking, as well as pay garages and meters, is offered to students as an alternative to buying a permit. Visit <http://www.parking.iupui.edu> for more details. The new student enrollment fee is a one-time fee assessed during the first term of enrollment for all degree-seeking students. Tuition and fees are determined each year in late spring by the Trustees of Indiana University. At the time of printing this booklet, we did not have the final fees for 2007–08. Students must pay all tuition and fees no later than the billing due date, which appears on your OneStart account. All billing notifications are sent electronically to your University e-mail address and are also available online at One Start.

A three-payment plan (PDO), called a personal deferment option, is also available to eligible students and will be offered as a minimum amount due on the electronic bill.

**Explanation of Undergraduate Fees**

**Student Activity Fee:** Income received is distributed to several units on campus in support of their global service, including the IUPUI Student Center, the Sagamore, and intramural sports.

**Athletic Development Fee:** The Athletic Development Fee is used to partially fund intercollegiate athletics at IUPUI, in conjunction with revenues from external sources. In exchange, each student receives free admission to all home athletics contests.

**Technology Fee:** Funds generated from the IUPUI technology fee are used to partially fund the ever-increasing student demand for computer capabilities, upgrade computer clusters, expand the permanent student user-identification accounts, expand computer consulting, upgrade learning centers, and more.

**New Student Enrollment Fee:** This non-refundable, mandatory fee is charged to all new and transfer students who are beginning their first degree-seeking semester at IUPUI. This fee will be assessed on the bursar bill and is not dependent on participation in the orientation program.

In addition to tuition and fees, student will have expenses related to textbooks that may be estimated at \$27 per semester hour. Furthermore, you need to plan for expenses in the areas of room and board, transportation, and miscellaneous expenses.
