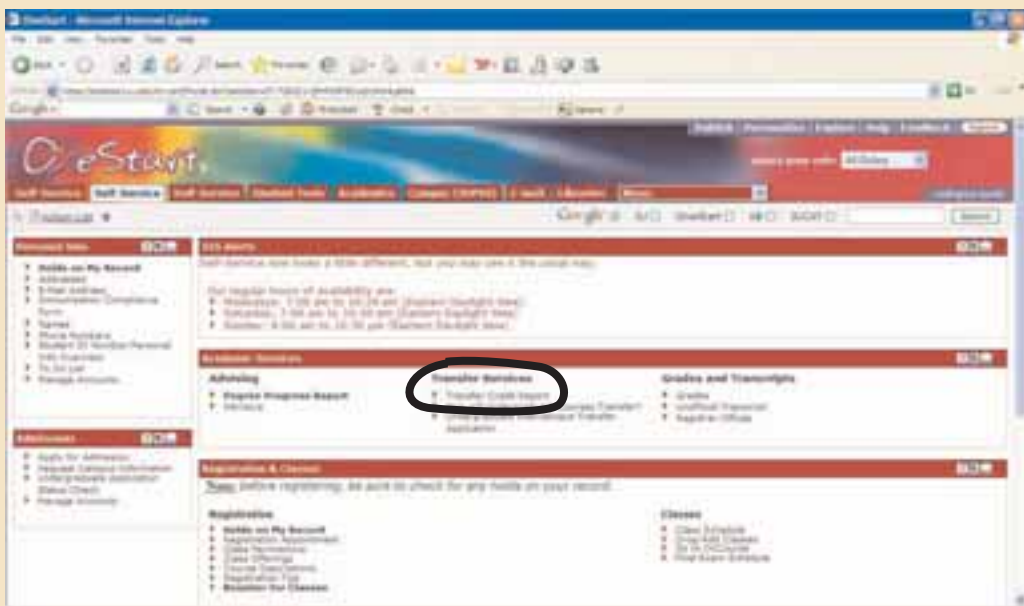


Reading Your Transfer Credit Report

Please take a few minutes to review this card to determine how we posted your transfer credits. Be sure to follow the steps outlined in other cards included with your admissions packet. This card only explains transfer credits. Before this step can be completed, you must have an assigned user name and password. See card titled "Important Information for Admitted Students" for the procedure for creating your user name and password.

If you do not have access to the Internet, please contact our credit evaluators at one of the numbers listed below.

This is an evaluation of how your credits transferred to IUPUI. During your meeting at orientation, your academic advisor will explain how these credits apply towards your planned major. A copy of this report is available via computer to other University personnel. It is important to understand that the decision as to how these classes will fit into your degree program is made by the IUPUI school through which you will be earning your degree. All transfer credit is subject to final approval by the dean of the IUPUI school in which you are enrolled.

Before examining the credit evaluation, note the following IUPUI practices.

1. All of the transcripts you provided with your application have been scanned electronically. Those transcripts are made available electronically to your IUPUI school.
2. You must earn C grades or higher for the course to transfer. Please note that courses with C- grades and D grades do not transfer. (Note: Purdue University

transfer students are exempted from this policy. For Purdue students, F grades are posted if the student is pursuing a Purdue major at IUPUI. F grades are not posted if the student is pursuing an IU major.) Grades of P or S also allow a course to be considered for transfer credit. Other grades (e.g. U, I, F, W) automatically exclude the course from transferring. If a course is repeated, only the course with the highest grade is evaluated. Grades from previous colleges/universities are listed on the Credit Transfer Report but are not reflected on an official Indiana University transcript. They are not used to compute your IUPUI grade point average, unless you are a transfer student from Purdue University and enrolled in a Purdue program. In some cases, transfer grades are used to calculate an admissions GPA for restricted programs.

3. If you have completed more than 90 hours of college-level work with C grades or higher and:
 - a. You are pursuing your first bachelor's degree: All 100-level, 200-level, and 300-level courses have been evaluated and posted. We only post 400-level work for the IUPUI school that is offering your new major. Some IUPUI schools do not accept 400-level transfer credit. If there are courses not listed at any level and your IUPUI advisor wishes them evaluated, he or she may send our office an e-mail or a memo identifying the course and institution, and we will determine the equivalency.
 - b. You are pursuing a second bachelor's degree: same policy as a.
 - c. You have a bachelor's degree and now are pursuing an associate's degree: All 100- and 200-level courses are posted along with all other courses relevant for the associate's degree. 300- and 400-level courses are rarely relevant.

However, if you and your advisor wish to have additional courses evaluated, he or she may send our office an e-mail or memo identifying the course and institution, and we will determine the equivalency.

- If you are pursuing a certificate, only relevant courses are evaluated. However, if you and your advisor wish to have additional courses evaluated, he or she may send our office an e-mail or memo identifying the course and institution, and we will determine the equivalency. This should be done only if the additional courses will be needed to earn the certificate or if you later plan to earn another undergraduate degree.
- Military training: For Purdue majors, there is a maximum of 8 hours of credit by faculty policy. For IU majors, our practice is to post no more than 15 hours of credit. If there has been additional training and your advisor believes additional credits can be granted, he or she should contact our credit evaluators in the Undergraduate Admissions Office.

To access the Credit Transfer Report, follow the screen shots showing you self-service in OneStart (onestart.iu.edu). Go to Academic Services and open "Transfer Credit Report." The second screen shot shows you an evaluation for a student.

This student attended Martin University. You see the following columns:

Transfer Term: This is the term the student is starting at IUPUI. **IMPORTANT NOTE:** If you start a different term, these credits will not appear on your transcript. Your first term as a transfer must be identical to your admit term. For example, if you are admitted for the summer but decide not to take summer courses and register for the fall semester, you have created a problem for yourself. You must first ask us to change your admission from summer to fall so those credits can be reposted.

External Subject: Course number at Martin University

Units Taken: Credit-hour value of course at Martin University

Grade Input: Grade earned in course

Equivalent Subject: IUPUI course and number

Units Transferred: Credit hours posted

In the screen shot example:

RP100 transferred as an elective (EDUC-UN 100). UN means there is no course equivalent, but the course transfers as freshmen-level elective credit. Only your advisor can decide if the course will count toward a requirement other than an elective.

HI 241 also transferred as an elective (HIST 200), and the 200 means it is a sophomore-level elective.

MA 130 did not transfer. Although the grade was acceptable, this was considered a nontransferable course. Besides grades below C, courses may not transfer because (a) we do not have a comparable department anywhere in the IU or Purdue system, (b) the course is considered a refresher course, or (c) see notes in the next section.

Please note:

- If you were admitted to IUPUI before you completed all of your coursework at your current college, remember to request that a final transcript be sent to us.
- Business courses taken at the 300- or 400-level are always transferred as elective credit. The IU Kelley School of Business will determine business course equivalencies after you have been accepted into its program.
- Clinical courses completed in undergraduate medical areas, nursing, and dental hygiene will not be transferred due to the specialized nature of these courses. The School of Medicine, School of Nursing, and School of Dentistry (Dental Hygiene) will determine if any of this coursework is transferable if you are accepted into that school's program.
- The Herron School of Art will determine how all studio art credits transfer if you are accepted into Herron.
